Stools – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

Our Stools are built to last, and with a little help from you, they will stay strong and clean for years to come. Here are some tips:

- Preserve your stools's condition by keeping the relative humidity level in the environment between 30% and 40%.
- Place your stool away from heat sources such as radiators, heating vents, and wood-burning stoves.
- Shield your furniture from direct sunlight exposure and extreme temperatures to keep the finish pristine.
- Use a mild soap and water solution to clean thoroughly. For tough spots, use a non-abrasive sponge.
- Wipe stools with a damp cloth to remove dust, dirt, or spills.
- Always dry stools with a clean cloth to prevent water spots or rust.
- Avoid harsh chemicals, abrasive pads, or ammonia-based cleaners. These can damage finishes or upholstery.



VINYL UPHOLSTERY

Always test a new cleaning product in an inconspicuous area to ensure it is safe to use.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Dip a soft cloth or sponge into dish soap with warm water and gently scrub the vinyl upholstery, focusing on any stained or soiled areas. Avoid using excessive water, as vinyl can be prone to water damage.

STAIN REMOVAL

- For tougher stains, make a paste using baking soda and water. Apply the paste to the stained area, then gently scrub with a soft brush or cloth.

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- Use a dry cloth or towel to pat the vinyl upholstery dry. To prevent it from drying out or cracking, you can apply a vinyl conditioner or protectant

WHAT TO AVOID

- Avoid using heat sources like hair dryers or heaters, as excessive heat can damage vinyl.



STEEL

Always test a new cleaning product in an inconspicuous area to ensure it is safe to use.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Dip a soft cloth or sponge into dish soap with warm water, wring it out, and wipe down the entire surface, including the seat, backrest, and legs.

STAIN REMOVAL

- For any stubborn spots or stains, use a soft-bristle brush to gently scrub the area. To prevent future rust, you can apply a thin layer of car wax or a metal protectant to the steel parts of the chair. This creates an added barrier against moisture.

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- Use a towel or dry cloth to thoroughly dry the chairs to prevent water spots and rust. Allow the chairs to air dry completely in a well-ventilated area before storing or using them.

WHAT TO AVOID

- Do not use abrasive cleaners or steel wool, as these can scratch and damage the steel surface.
