Fold In Half Tables – General Care & Maintenance Instructions

Our Fold in Half Tables are built to last, and with a little help from you, they will stay strong and clean for years to come. Here are some tips:

- Preserve its condition by keeping the relative humidity level in the environment between 30% and 40%.
- Place it away from heat sources such as radiators, heating vents, and wood-burning stoves.
- Shield your furniture from direct sunlight exposure and extreme temperatures to keep the finish pristine.
- Place protective mats or carpets on high-traffic areas to minimize wear.
- Use a damp cloth with mild soap to clean the surfaces.
- Use a soft broom, vacuum cleaner, or microfiber cloth to remove dust and debris after every use.
- Lift and move heavy objects instead of dragging them to prevent scratches or gouges.
- Avoid abrasive cleaners or solvents that can damage finishes or cause discoloration.
- Use dust covers or tarps to shield from dirt and moisture.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Regularly clean the material with a gentle cleaning solution to prevent the buildup of dirt and grime. Promptly clean up any spills to prevent staining.

KEY CLEANING SOLUTIONS

- Create a solution using a mild dish soap and warm water, and with a damp cloth, wipe off any marks.

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- After cleaning, use a dry, clean cloth to wipe the material dry thoroughly. Ensure that no water is left on the surface to prevent damage.

WHAT TO AVOID

- Avoid using harsh cleaners or abrasives on the powder-coated steel. These can damage the finish and cause it to fade or chip. Also, extreme temperatures can damage the finish and make it more susceptible to chipping and cracking.



Plastic

Always test a new cleaning product in an inconspicuous area to ensure it is safe to use.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Dip a sponge or soft-bristled brush into dish soap with warm water and scrub the plastic thoroughly. Pay extra attention to any areas with visible stains or grime buildup.

STAIN REMOVAL

- If the material have stubborn stains or mildew, you can try using a solution of equal parts water and white vinegar. Apply the solution to the affected areas, let it sit for a few minutes, then scrub and rinse as usual.

DRYING IMPORTANCE

- If possible, let the plastic dry in sunlight. Sunlight can help to naturally disinfect and deodorize the plastic.

WHAT TO AVOID

- Avoid using abrasive cleaners like scouring powders or steel wool, as they can scratch and dull the plastic.
